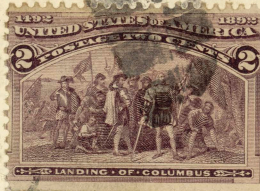

The enclosed from Uncle James
rather distressed me in the
middle of my headache but now
I think it only arose from Uncle
James anxiety. I told him that
my mind was irrevocably made
up to serve under no one
as Dean, not under Father, not
under himself, under no one,
that I had assumed a false
position once and never should
assume one a second time.

After I had written the letter
on returning from Faculty meeting

I went to bed & my headache
 was very bad for what seemed
 to me hrs. Then I waked up
without it & slept till 8. I
 opened chapel & all this morning
 till 4 have seen ^{& people in the place} prof. about
 engagements, from 4 to 5 I have
 attended to the grounds &
 seen prof. about planting near
 their cottages etc & now I have
 an hr for you.

Yr Mondays letter written
 Sat. & Sunday did not say
 whether my special delivery or
 Sunday had arrived - I suppose
