Local Civil Defense **Readies for All-Out** "Operation Alert"

"Operation Alert", a fullscale civil defense training exercise, will be held Monday, June 14. All 48 states as well as Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Alaska and the Canadian provinces will take part.

State officials report that the alert will be based on a presumed atomic attack on 42 critical target areas, of which Philadelphia and its Delaware River enterprises are one.

Local CD officials say there will be a signal alert in the morning when police will stop traffic for 10 minutes and the public is expected to_take shelter or follow the suggestions of wardens. The exercise will show how much trained and volunteer personnel will be available on a day-time basis. There may be another alert on signal that night.

Personnel Needed

Local defenses are undermanned, especially for day-time occurrences, according to Charles Russell, local chairman. New volunteers, as well as those who have signed up but have had no training, are asked to report to their Post Wardens at area headquarters (see map page 9) and be assigned. If there is no immediate job, such volunteers are asked to be content to stand by and observe the operation. After the all-clear, Post wardens will explain how they can fit into the organization. The need is greater than ever, before, Russell comnented.



lay no longer in adopting its 1954-55 budget so took action on a financial set-up balancing at \$701,400 for the new fiscal year beginning the first Monday in July. This represents a decrease of \$24,000 in expenses and an in-

crease of \$19,000 in income to offset the \$43,000 deficit in May 19th's rough draft.

Resetting all tax rates at the legal hilt the Board estimates an income of \$240,500 from the 35 mill realty levy, \$43,500 from two per capita taxes totaling \$15, \$18,000 from 1% realty transfer levies, \$9,750 from interim taxes on newly improved properties, and \$3,500 on delinquent taxes.

\$47,000 is due from State appropriations, \$93,050 from tuition students, \$12,000 in short term loans for furnishing the new elementary building and other long term investments not covered by current income, and \$1400 in rentals and other incidentals. A balance of \$54,000 including teachers' summer salary reserve, and \$178,000 in the building fund for the Rutgers avenue addition com-

plete the \$701,400 income side of the sheet. About \$17,000 over last year's taxes is expected, and \$18,000 in tuition increases.

It was stated that 6.4 mills of the realty tax will be used for debt service and the remaining 28.6 for general purposes and teachers salaries.

A total increase of \$12,100 in teachers' salaries was voted. This includes \$4,400 state mandated increments and \$7,700 service merited raises. The total amounts to an average increase of \$257.45 among the district's 47 teachers. The Board as a whole approved the importance of the salary increases. although it meant further postponement of repair and modernization of the high school electrical system and other needed maintenance. Memorial Day Speaker Cites Need for Doers


"America is suffering from a bad case of 'speakitis' and 'listenitis' when the world and nation want someone with 'do-itis' ". the Rev. John C. Kulp told the perfect-day turnout of Borough residents at Monday morning's Memorial Day rifes.

Citing current Washington hearings as prime symptom of a national malady, the Swarthmore Methodist Church pastor and former Navy chaplain said, "The dead we honor did with lives what we cannot do. They gave their lives because they were asked to, — that men might be free to live, to learn, and to build. Today the nations of the world are watching America to see if she will carry this era's general 'doit-yourself fad to real purpose. We are not called upon now to make or take up arms. Our surplus energy should be used to export the Christian way of life. Asia wants us to do it. The three difficulties there are hunger, illness, need for learning. Hand in hand with missionaries must go

"Our Lord said, 'Be not hearers of the word only, but doers also'. We cannot do for others until we do for ourselves by living as the Lord provided. We must 'do-itourselves' in the spirit of Christbuilding with the master plan He gave us."

## Alert Citizens for Air Raid Test Mothers Club 'Sometime' Mon., Between 9-2

Sometime between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Monday, June 14, three air raid warning signals will be sent out on a statewide basis. The first will be the "Lemon Juice" signal, a code name for the "yellow" warning. This signal will be for county and local Civil Defense personnel only. The second, the "Apple Jack" or "red" alert will be the public's first and only warning of a simulated (or real) air raid. The coded "Snow Man" or "white" all-clear will end the practice alert.

The red signal is a three minute warbling of sirens, or short blasts on the whistles. The white signal is a oneminute steady blast, of sirens or whistles, then two minutes of silence; then a one minute steady blast, followed by two minutes of silence, and concluding with the third one minute steady blast.
